## Mahidol University, Thailand November 8-10, 2016

#### 1. Background

The Mobile classroom is initiated at AUN's first meeting in October 2015. The member universities agreed upon establishing a camp where university students from different ASEAN countries can meet and build cross-cultural relationships. To help students learn about other cultures, each county takes turn in hosting the camp. Each year, two countries have the opportunity to host two separate mobile classrooms. One of them is on Route 1 which covers Singapore, Malaysia, and Thailand. The other is on Route 2 which covers Thailand, Vietnam, Cambodia, Lao PDR, and Myanmar.
